Universities

The University of Adelaide was ranked number 62nd in the world by the 2007 Times Higher Education Supplement. Established in 1874, it is associated with five Nobel prize winners and 100 Rhodes Scholars. As one of Australia's most research intensive universities, it has significant strengths in bio-medical sciences, physical sciences, engineering, IT, food & wine and social sciences.

Foundation Studies

TAFE SA

Professional and practical learning is at the heart of Vocational and Education Training (VET). English Language Courses
